MINUTE ORDER:

”Mr. Willis failed to make it clear that he was supposedly ‘*speciallly appearing*’ to explain to Mr. McAfee’s absence attributable to his kidney condition. Mr. McAfee’s purported **challenge to this court’s jurisdiction**, echoed in Mr. Willis’s utterly confused declaration filed on March 9, 2004 is palpably unfounded, but the court will not explore further sanctions for such frivolous filings unless they are repeated in the future.”

TRANSCRIPT: 03.01.2004 (Transcript also deals with the issue of discovery)

Page 4, Lines 16-17

JUDGE: "Good afternoon."

WILLIS: "Jack Willis *appearing specially* for Mr. McAfee, *appearing specially* also."

WILLIS: "[I] am not familiar with a code section or a rule of the court, nor is the U.S. Attorney able to cite me one just a moment ago, which permitted in personam jurisdiction to apply to anybody who is a member of the court."

JUDGE: "I don't recognize you as the equivalent of Mr. McAfee. You have to understand that."
